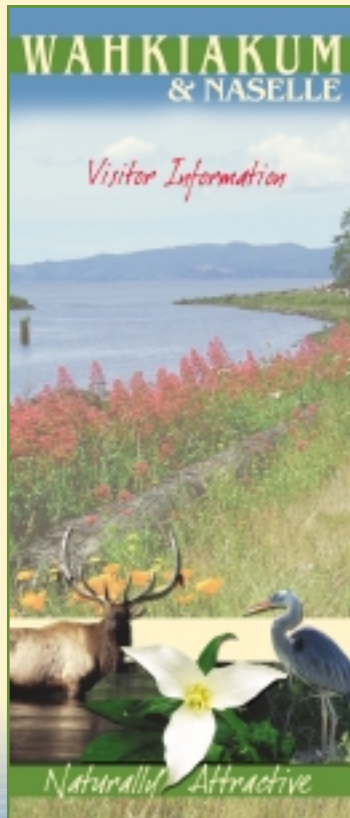

Nestled in the Willapa Hills, Naselle has been home to hundreds of Finns and Finnish-Americans since the mid-1800s. The name, considerably altered from the original, is that of a division of the Chinook people, the Nisal. In numbered years, the community celebrates its Finnish heritage with a Finnish American Folk Festival the last week of July, with traditional dance, arts, crafts, food and much more. Visit the Naselle River Fish Hatchery, Willapa National Wildlife Refuge and Radar Lakes Recreation Area.

Grays River and Rosburg are picturesque farming communities located on the Grays River. Scenic drives and cycling routes are popular attractions in the area. The historic Grays River Covered Bridge and Deep River Lutheran Church are a must-see. Other sites include Rosburg Hall where a Crab and Oyster Feed is held every March. Both communities boast wonderful fishing, hunting and camping opportunities.

Attractions

Deep River Lutheran Church
About two miles up Deep River Road between Grays River and Naselle is the beautiful Deep River Lutheran Church. A hidden piece of early Scandinavian architecture that was lovingly restored. Across from the church is a small cemetery, with graves from the early 1800's. The Finnish gravestones tell tales of the hardships of our earliest settlers.

The Grays River Covered Bridge

One of the most scenic drives in the state brings you to the Grays River Covered Bridge, the last one in public use in the state. Built in 1905, the bridge is still used everyday. The 100 year old historic landmark hosts a Covered Bridge Festival in August. Locals celebrate the local treasure with music, food and games! Everyone is welcome.

National historic district and site of an Indian village over 2,000 years old. Skamokawa means "Smoke on the Water" and was the name of an Indian chief that Lewis and Clark met while heading west to the ocean. Skamokawa is known best for its scenic views and unique history and was once a bustling town when the fishing and logging industries that sustained it thrived. It is now a popular place to kayak, fish, go canoeing, biking or camping. Vista Park is a must-see and includes one of eight Lewis and Clark Heritage sites in Wahkiakum County.

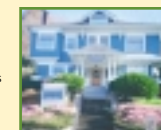
